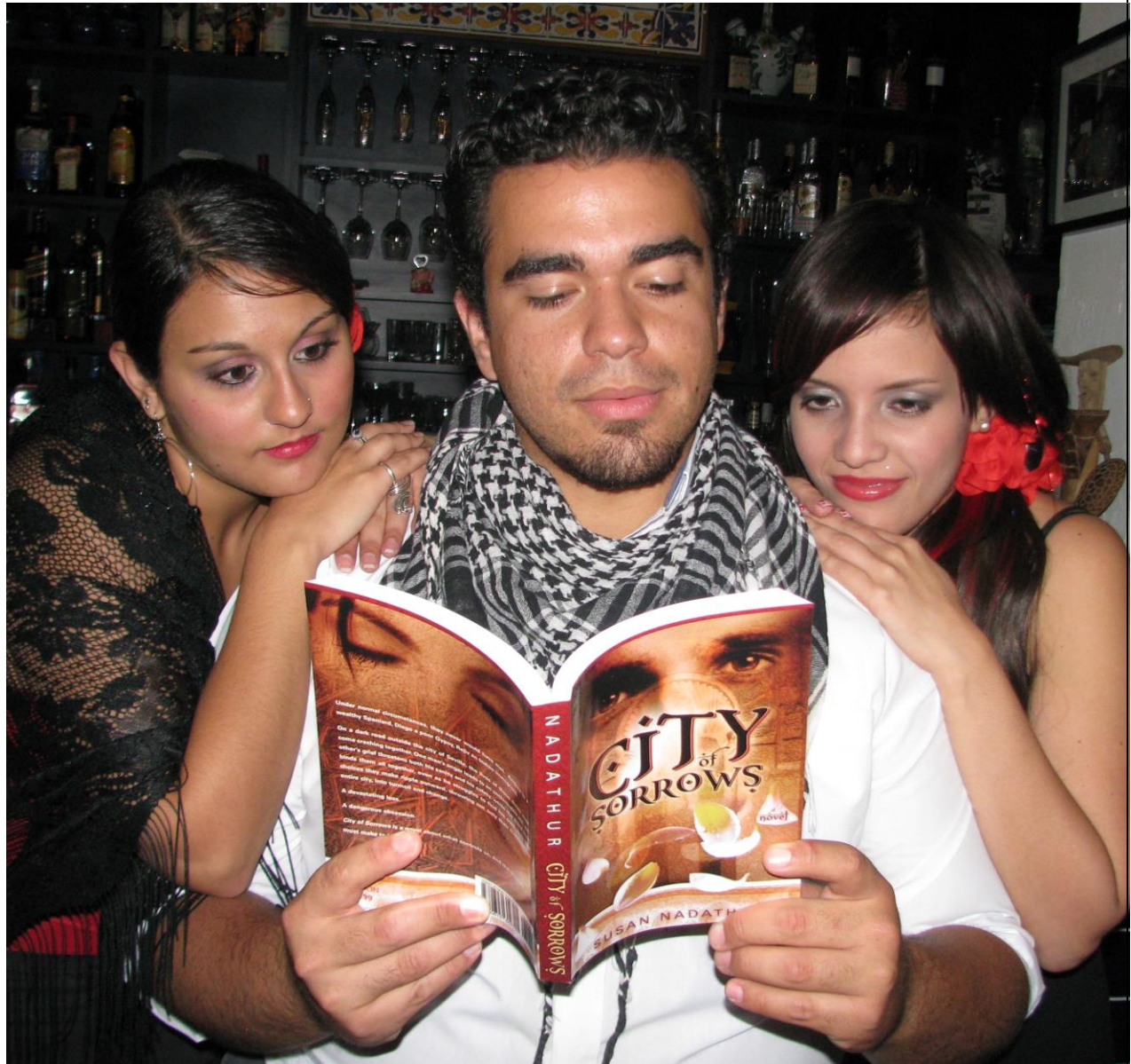

Lajas, Puerto Rico – March 2013 – A daring new novel is attracting attention for its up-close look into the mysterious world of the Spanish Gypsy. *City of Sorrows* will be presented to the public on April 19, 2013 at La Casa de Espana in Old San Juan. The public is invited.

Mainstream society – both in Europe and the United States – has been at odds with the Gypsies since their migration from India in the 15th century. The Gypsies have lived most of their history accused of being different, non-conformists, and problematic. They have been marginalized, stereotyped, persecuted, glorified, and underappreciated. But never before have they been valued as models for a way of life that has nothing to do with flamenco, stolen car rings, drugs, and robbing unsuspecting tourists – until the book *City of Sorrows* (Azahar Books, 2012).

City of Sorrows is the debut literary work from Lajas author Susan Nadathur. The novel portrays a way of life that most people don't see, but can certainly benefit from. Historically wary and suspicious of outsiders, the Gypsies stick to themselves and rarely allow people from the outside in. But over the last four years, Susan Nadathur was given the unique opportunity to live with a family of Gypsies in Seville. From that experience, she penned this book.

The author will be presenting her book at La Casa de Espana in Old San Juan on Friday, April 19, 2013 from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. A group of students from the music department of the Inter American University, San German Campus, will be interpreting Spanish zarzuelas and the author will be signing books and talking about her experiences with the Gypsies in Spain. There will be light refreshments, raffles and prizes. The event is free of charge and open to the public.

Susan Nadathur has become active as an advocate for Gypsies and other marginalized populations. She currently maintains a blog with research, stories and news at <http://susannadathur.com>. The author is available for interviews, book club appearances, speaking engagements and/or guest articles on the subjects of Spanish Gypsy culture, outcasts, outsiders, the effects of bullying, and writing. She resides with her family in Lajas, Puerto Rico.

About The Singers

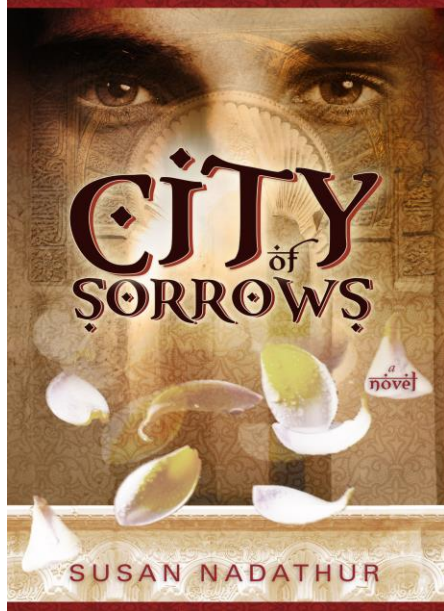

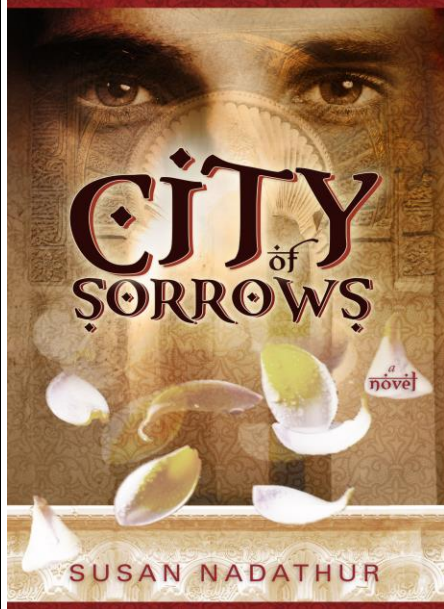
